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## NEW PRODUCTS AND NEWS ABOUT VICTORINOX

Effective September 2002, Swiss Army Brands<sup>TM</sup>, the USA distributor of Victorinox® products, became the wholly owned subsidiary of Victorinox® Switzerland. The once public company will now be a sales and marketing extension of the factory. As a direct result of this change in ownership, Swiss Army Brands<sup>TM</sup> will begin offering many new knife models to the USA market. A new dealer catalog, which will include all new items, will be available in February 2003.

Among the new items will be several 111mm lock blade models, including the Equestrian, Outrider, Jumpmaster, and Workchamp XLT. The Workchamp XLT will be the largest of its kind, and will offer all of the implements found in the lock blade series. A series of 9 "Alox" aluminum handled knives, previously only offered for sale in Europe, will also be introduced.

A new concept knife called "My first Victorinox® knife", will be introduced in early 2003. It will consist of one round tipped large blade and a cap lifter/screwdriver tool. The round tip blade on this knife will offer some measure of safety for young users.

All in all, about 50 new models/variations will be coming to the USA market. This should be exciting news for all of you collectors out there... A few new models were also introduced this past fall by Victorinox® (note page 2 camouflage handled knives, Shadow Grass and Breakup are now available in the following models: Climber, Huntsman, Tinker and Classic). We have also heard a rumor that a new, smaller version of the Swisstool is on the drawing board.

Many of you have inquired about the knife with a butane lighter currently being sold in Europe. This knife unfortunately, will not be available in the USA in the near future, due to liability issues.

The year 2003 promises to be an eventful one for members of our club interested in the evolution of the line of Victorinox® knives.

## **Airport searches find** 15,982 pocket knives

WASHINGTON (AP) — Some passengers still haven't gotten the word about what they can and can't take on planes. Seized at airports during the Thanksgiving crush: 15,982 pocket knives, 98 boxcutters, the government has tightsix guns and a brick.

I was recently able to enlist the help of a translator, and with his help, have been able to translate a number of pieces of information in my archive. This information will be forthcoming in newsletters as it pertains to subject articles. It will also be very valuable information in the books, and will help to answer questions for some collectors about some of their knives.

This first book will be a jumping off point, and will have to be up-dated and revised as new information is received. You, the members are part of the archive that can make this happen, and you are invited to participate. I need your input now and on an ongoing basis, to correct errors (and there will be some), to add new information, and to build the information as revisions are made. Are you willing to help? It will be to everyone's benefit, after all, we are a collectors club, and that's what we are supposed to be about.

Why you ask do I start with a book dedicated to 58mm knives? Did you know that I have information about 33 different models and more than 300 variations within these models of knives in this size range? And I continue to find even more. At one time (in 1987), Victorinox produced more than 850 different models and variations of all sizes of knives — in just pocket knives! There were also kitchen knives and other tools and accessories that I won't even attempt to get into. This is a company that is unbelievably busy, and the books will show a portion of it. Will you come on board and help?

And one other request. We have room for more members. Let's beat the bushes and find them – they're out there. Let's make an effort and bring them in!!!!!!!!! Let's all make an effort to have this be a banner year in more ways than one.
